The Citizen of the Year award was enthusiastically awarded to Barbara and Damon LaJune. Sid Baunsgard, Glenn Yates, Frank/Gerry Lewis and Esther Goetsch also received their much deserved "Service to the Community" awards. This celebrated evening was video-taped for future enjoyment. The event was doubly "warm" because the insulation in the main room in the hall has been completed. Thanks go to Al Bacon for the re-wiring job that had to be accomplished prior to the insulation being installed. Also a big thanks to all the volunteers that worked on this project and spent many hours in the attic crawling through spider webs to shore up the ceiling. The main hall floor also received a bit of spit and polish. Various volunteers laid carpeting at the doorways and scrubbed, waxed and polished the maple floor returning it to its original golden luster. These jobs, and others, were partially funded by the proceeds from last year's All-Island Spaghetti Dinner. A big thank you goes to Ginny Briesmeister who chaired the dinner last year and has offered to chair it again this year. We all look forward to this tasty fund raising event.
