CRIME WATCH The Harstine Island Crime Watch (H.I.C.W.) is in its third year of operation. Periodically, Mason County Sheriffs Department sent representatives to Crime Watchers monthly meetings to give an update on countywide crime issues. A decrease in crime was reported for Harstine Island. H.I.C.W. is currently looking for community members to assist in crime watch patrols one day a month. These patrols attempt to curb crime by showing a regular and consistent presence. The patrols consist of a two hour shift driving the county roads or parking at the "T" entrance to the Island to make their presence known. Fire District #5 District #5, Station #9, welcomes two new recruits, John Graham and Ean Anderson, and special recognition is offered to Fred Burgdorf, Lt.Station 5-11. Fred is retiring after 20 years of service. His leadership and experience has been invaluable to those with Station 9 and 11 and to all who reside here, and he will be missed. Be sure to express your "thanks" when you see him.

Also retiring this past year was John Cook, Irene Goldsby, and Harry and Sharon Cook of Station 5. All have been with the district since its early days and have contributed so much to the community. Many Thanks!

Taking over John's position as Battalion Chief for the Harstine, Agate and Pickering area is our very own Gary Hink.

District #5 offers several services to the community to help educate and prepare folks for safety and prevention. Imagine how frustrating and frightening it would be to know that someone desperately needs help but the fire and/or emergency personnel cannot find your address because it is not clearly marked. Address Markers are available for \$15.00. These markers (blue numbers on a bright yellow "post") enable the fire and emergency personnel to locate your address more quickly in an emergency. They make great gifts and installation is free if the address is within the district.

Also offered are home safety inspections. Trained District 5 personnel will visit your home at your request to identify fire and safety hazards. The inspections take about an hour and there is no cost for this valuable service.

CPR and First Aid Training is periodically offered. The cost for the 4 hour Adult CPR class is \$10.00. For the 8 hour Medic First Aid Class, (which includes American Heart Association certified CPR training),

the cost is \$20.00. The fees pay for books and materials and a small instructor stipend.

The District maintains a reference file of individuals with special needs. If you require special assistance in a the event of severe storm, extended power outage, earthquake or other wide area emergency, please let the fire district know and they will add you to their list.

Lastly, Fire District # 5 offers these safety tips:

- Keep a 72 hr. emergency kit for each family member (don't forget pets).
- Practice safe burning outdoors.
- Practice home fire drills.
- Keep access to your home well marked and cleared for easy access.

The District is always looking for new volunteers. If you are interested in this service to the community, call District Headquarters at 426-5533 for more information. Remember, actual fire fighting is only one of the many talents needed. Give them a call, you may fit right in!
