Harstine Island Crime Watch reports good news about crime on the island. Island crime for 2003 was down 20% compared to 2002. Violation of drug laws was significantly lower, with only about a quarter of the number reported this year compared to last year. Civil complaints were down 33%. Theft, burglary, vandalism and trespassing showed a 10% decrease.

Mason County Sheriff Steve Whybark mentioned the local program in his successful grant application for funds for further work in Neighborhood Watch programs. Crime Watch meets at the Community Hall at 7:00 P.M. the 3rd Wednesday of each month. Newcomers are invited to attend this meeting and will be invited to join the roster of people who make Harstine Island a safer place in which to live. Fire District #5

During 2003, fire fighters manning the two volunteer stations responded to 97 calls versus 76 in 2002. There were 69 aid calls, 14 fire calls, 8 service calls and 6 burn complaints. This is in line with overall District 5 responses which were up 14 – 15% over previous years.

Nick Arthur and Colleen Benson are presently serving as volunteer residents at Station 10 on John's Prairie. When their home is finished being built on McMicken Road, they will again become responders for Station 11. We added 6 EMT's with Jon Gorman returning home after

retirement from the Air Force, and Tom Ryan, Nick Arthur, Colleen Benson, DeeAnn Meacham and Tiffany Morrison completing extensive training and getting certified this past year.

District 5 has 11 stations for 150 sq. miles, two of which are staffed 24 hours with a paramedic and an EMT response crew. Another station serves as District HQ, communication Center (FIRECOM) and administrative office. Mason 5 staff and volunteers are providing the best possible service and well trained, dedicated personnel.

District 5 offers several services to help educate and prepare the community for emergencies. These include:

Address Markers to clearly mark your residence for respondersminimal fee and free installation

Home Safety Inspections to help you identify fire and other safety hazards- inspections free

CPR and First Aid Training to train you in basic life saving measures – minimal cost

Reference File – District maintains file of residents in the district with special medical needs and maintains fire pre-plans of commercial and some residential buildings.

All members of Fire District 5 are also members of Mason 5 Fire Fighters Association, a nonprofit, charitable organization. Members, along with the career staff local union, contribute time, effort and funding for equipment and station needs and help those in need within the fire service and the community. *Written by Nick Neuerburg*

Harstine Island Theatre Foundation Update

Some real progress was made in 2003 in the Foundation's goal for a Cultural Arts and Recreation Center on the island. Most importantly, Mason County completed the purchase of an eight-acre land parcel on Harstine Island Road North, running south from Yates Road. This site was the same site the Foundation proposed to purchase from the Washington State Dept. of Parks and Recreation. A poll-questionnaire mailed last year indicated 75% of the polled landowners who responded favored a park site at this location.

The second major advancement in the journey for a Cultural Arts Center was the final approval of the Mason County Comprehensive Development Plan by the State of Washington Hearings Board. This means that this site and other county sites can now be developed per an 'approved' zoning ordinance and comprehensive plan, subject to required public hearings and final approval by the County Commissioners.

We now have several new board members and have met with our new Advisory Board in September 2003. Two of our board members attended an excellent class in grant writing, which will reap many benefits in the near future.


Theatre Club

At a minimum, thousands of articles move annually from one home to another. It has been reported that some items actually leave the island. Proceeds from this event were dedicated to a new kitchen floor and counter top in the Community Hall. Jim and Ruth Irish also chaired the Thanksgiving Dinner. Over eighty individuals were served at the Hall and numerous dinners were delivered to some of our elder neighbors and the ill. The Community Hall serves again as a warm gathering place for residents to share-fellowship and Christmas Dinner.

The preceding events, in combination with those events sponsored by the various clubs, are affirmation that our Community Hall endures as the focal point of our island community. Our thanks go to all those who have volunteered many hours of service throughout the year to the Community Club, the Community Hall and our community.
