

Bridge Community Church



Garden Club





2004 FIRE DISTRICT 5 REPORT

As of December 26, 2004, fire fighters operating the two volunteer stations on Harstine Island responded to 101 calls on the island. This number does not include the numerous off island calls. There were 97 combined calls last year, so our responses have increased. The call breakdown is 68 medical (illness and injury), 22 fire, which includes any structure fire, brush fire, smoke investigations, and burn complaints, 5 MVA (motor vehicle accidents), 5 service (citizen assists) and 1 drug lab call.

Harstine Island has an all-volunteer staff, with full-time paid staff on the mainland as backup. Station 9 next to the Community Hall houses one engine and one basic life support aid car. Station 11 across from Island Shores Road on the south end, houses one engine and one brush truck.

Fire District 5 serves 150 sq. miles in Mason County with ten stations, two of which are staffed 24/7 with a paramedic and an EMT response crew. Another station serves as District HQ and Communication Center (FIRECOM) and administrative office. Mason 5 paid and volunteer workers are ready to assist you and are committed to providing the best service possible, with well trained and dedicated personnel.

District 5 offers several services to help educate and prepare the public for emergencies. These services include address markers to clearly mark your residence for responders, home safety inspections to help identify fire and other safety hazards, CPR and first aid training in basic life saving measures, a reference file for residents within the district with special medical needs and pre-fire plans on commercial and some residential buildings.

Members of Fire District 5 are also members of Mason 5 Fire Fighters Association, a nonprofit, charitable organization. They contribute their time, efforts and funding to benefit their department and community by providing various equipment or station needs and supporting those in need in the community. *Nick Neuerburg*



Harstine Island Theatre Foundation Update

Planning continues on a cultural arts center that will add a new dimension to Mason County residents. The nearly ten-year vision to establish a center for performing and visual arts has moved closer to reality. Mason County Parks and Recreation Department has purchased approximately ten acres from the Washington State Parks Commission. The Cultural Arts Foundation is currently working with Mason County to dedicate this property to the construction of the Cultural Arts Center. The property has been surveyed. The twelve member Harstine Island Theater and Cultural Arts Center Foundation Board has chosen an architectural firm. The firm is in the process of drawing up a preliminary site plan that will be submitted to Mason County for approval.

In 1914 Harstine Islanders took a giant leap forward when they built the Community Hall. That facility has well served the social needs of island

residents for ninety years. The Cultural Arts Center will provide another venue for the performing and visual arts. The center not only will offer modern facilities for local theatrical productions, but will also provide a performance space for professional artists to present recitals, concerts and dramatic productions. Work and display spaces are planned for ceramics, sculpture, painting and other visual arts.

The Foundation views the center as an educational facility that will give children and adults experiences and skills in the cultural arts. A major goal for the center is to offer classes for all ages, from the very young to senior adults, in the various areas

of the cultural arts such as painting, sculpturing, dance, music and theater.

Local school districts have welcomed the cultural arts center concept and have expressed interest in cooperating and assisting with the project.

The Cultural Arts Center is a unique endeavor. The vision is becoming reality. It will be a source of pride, but most importantly it will serve Mason County as a much needed cultural resource. The Harstine Island Cultural Arts Center Foundation is registered as a 501-C3 foundation. All gifts and donations are recognized as tax deductible. Contributions can be sent





Harstine Island Women's Club

Besides many good recipes, there are bits and pieces of history and things written by some of those pioneer women!

The club meets eleven months of the year, with July being a bit of a "time out." The meetings begin with a brown-bag lunch, interspersed with a soup luncheon in March, an outing in the spring and a Christmas extravaganza. There is lots of visiting and a business meeting and a program carefully chosen with the interests of the islanders in mind. Annual dues are \$15.00.

2004 HICC Operating Statement

Greetings! Our membership remains strong at 260. Completing refinishing the Hall floor at \$2500 was our major Hall improvement, with furnace repair and a new water heater accounting for the lion's share of maintenance expenses. Total utilities remained remarkably similar to last year at \$3400. Insurance coverage increased 15% to \$5200. The Net Worth Report for 2004 shows the Cemetery CD at \$8107.48; Cemetery Checking at \$1290.25 and the Cemetery Savings at \$632.57. The HICC Checking is at \$2447.69 and HICC Savings at \$5083.56. The total income for the year is \$19,586.67 and expenses were \$19,162.05.

Theatre Club

2004 brought a mixture of theater performances that could all be called "retro."

The spring performance, "Don't Drink the Water" written by Woody Allen and directed by Ed Woods, took place during the cold war years. The summer play, "Fads and Fancies" was written by our own John Cooper, and was directed by Whickey Hopkins. This vaudeville production was set between 1940 and 1970 with events and songs unknown by many and forgotten by others!
