Children and adults from miles around come to participate in a delightful morning of making cider, eating apple products and*

fresh-baked donuts. Inside the hall, traditional arts and crafts artisans demonstrate their time-honored skills. To round out the day, live music is provided for your toe-tapping pleasure.

When spring rolls around and you get ready to create window boxes and planters, remember the Garden Club's **plant sale** scheduled for 5 May. You can purchase many or all of the plants you need, plus garden art and bird houses, all at very good prices while supporting the club's scholarship fund raising. Neighborhood Watch also meets at the hall. Members of this group patrol about 62 miles of island roads, reporting suspicious activity to the sheriff, and keeping islanders informed of unusual events.

TOPS (Take Off Pounds Sensibly) also meets each week. If you need a support group to help you keep in shape, this is the group for you.

If card playing is your hobby, we hope **pinochle** is your game. There are several groups that meet at different times to challenge their neighbors.

Seamstresses also have their place on Harstine. This group has monthly meetings in various homes, usually every third Tuesday of the month from 10:00 to 2:00, to enjoy a variety of handiwork, relaxation and lunch.

Bridge Community Church...

...also uses the hall for the time being. It celebrated its 10th Anniversary in November, 2006. Here is how it started.

In the mid 40's, two couples on Harstine Island desired for the children of the island to have the opportunity to be involved in Sunday School and church. Mr. and Mrs. Pearson and Mr. and Mrs. Pinard sought help from the American Sunday School Union which established Sunday Schools across our nation and in out-of-the-way places. They contacted Pastor and Mrs. Knautz of Tacoma who began coming to Harstine, conducting Sunday School at the school house near Jarrell Cove. During the summer they conducted a Bible camp at Island Lake near Gig Harbor. Two girls from Harstine Island, Lena Wingert and Willa Streckenbach, attended the camp and had a wonderful, never-to-be-forgotten time. When the Sunday School closed because the Knautz's were assigned to another area, the children went to Shelton churches.

One of the 'campers' later longed to have a Bible camp and Sunday School here on the island and formed a committee which included David Allison, Don and Vi Burrows, Jim and Sally Doherty, David Roller, and Willa Smith to pray and organize this. Later, Mel and Lyla Hadley, with American Missionary Fellowship (formerly American Sunday School Union), moved to the area and joined in the effort. When Pastor and Mrs. Howard Spear moved to Shelton and joined the group, the committee sought a place for the Sunday school and church to meet. The Harstine Community Club graciously agreed to rent the Hall on Sundays for that purpose. The church first met in November, 1996, and has been growing to the point of being filled during summer months. The church is now developing plans for a church building just north of the bridge. Many have already contributed toward this project. Our church has a down home feeling and intimacy that comes from a truly caring group of people. (Oh, the two little girls who went to the Bible camp in the '40's are there, too). The church seeks to serve genuine needs in the community and help people come to a living relationship with Jesus Christ. You are welcome to come and join in the fellowship.

FIRE DISTRICT 5

We are fortunate to have 2 fire stations on Harstine Island. Station 9 is next to the community hall. Station 11 is on the south end of the island near Island Shores Road. Station 9 houses a fire engine and a basic life support ambulance. Four volunteers man the station. They are Tom Ryan and Rob Stephens, Firefighter/EMT; Steve Meacham and Tony Enslow, Firefighter. Station 11 has a fire engine. Four volunteers staff this station. They are Nick Neuerburg, Lt. and Station Officer; Nick Arthur, Lt. Firefighter/EMT; Colleen Benson, Firefighter/EMT; Craig Holly, Firefighter.

Fire District 5 covers 150 sq. miles of central Mason County. It has 10 stations, 2 of which are staffed around the clock by Firefighter/Paramedic and Firefighter/EMT crews. Another station serves as headquarters and administration office. They provide full-time mainland support for island volunteers.

Island volunteers responded to 98 calls in 2006, compared to 89 in 2005 and 101 in 2004. Of those 98 calls, 90 were for medical emergencies and 69 were level 3 calls (serious). Fire calls included 1 structure fire, a couple brush fires and a couple smoke investigations and burn complaints.

Along with regular duties of responding to medical, fire, motor vehicle accidents and service calls, our Fire District provides address markers, free home inspections, CPR and First Aid training, as well as other safety education such as emergency preparedness and fire prevention.

Harstine Island was the first in Mason County to host a **Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)** training program. CERT currently has 9 members trained in basic firstaid, including CPR and defibrillator use, triage, search and rescue, fire extinguisher use and disaster preparedness. The district plans to conduct more classes in the future for any interested in getting involved. Members receive a backpack with emergency supplies and county liability insurance. More members are needed! Please

Each of the clubs does a lot more than what has been highlighted in this commentary. Most of the clubs offer scholarships to up-and-coming youths in our area. Another fun island activity is the **Children's Carnival**. Women's Club sponsors this very popular event. Local youth and adults work together as clowns or managers of a variety of game booths. Gleeful kids move from booth to booth, trying their skills at the various tasks, and receiving rewards for their efforts. Little hobo bags are carried over the shoulders of the happy children as they play through the morning.

Women's Club also hosts the **Holiday House** craft sale. The weekend after Thanksgiving the hall fills with all sorts of items that Santa could deliver to fine girls and boys. There are wreaths for the walls, houses for the birds, dishes for the table, food for friends and items of every type to help you prepare for the holiday season.

The island women are quite busy with meetings and projects. The March meeting is a soup lunch, May is the Spring Luncheon, June offers a picnic at the Point, September has a theme luncheon and December includes a Christmas Luncheon. Besides eating, they have a variety of interesting programs during most meetings. One of the club's services projects to the community is to provide lunches at the Community Hall following funerals, with the women providing the side dishes. Other community services include monthly donations of \$50 each to two local food banks (\$1200), and they provide 3 island students with scholarships of \$500.



Last year's oyster and ham dinner at the hall was delicious! The Harstine Island Grange #568 served supper with a flourish as you might guess from the photo of some of the helpers. They use the income for scholarships and other community services such as helping provide books to schools, toys and clothes to the hospital, food to the needy and scholarships for continued education.






