## President's Report

Success! As of March 3, 2010 the IRS recognized HICC as a 501C3 tax-exempt charitable organization. Letter in hand; Dudley Panchot notified the HICC board at the March board meeting. The process was long and required the hard work of a number of fellow islanders along with the support and vote of the HICC membership. Dudley and Anne Panchot along with Ted Woodward spearheaded the yearlong process of documentation, filling out reams of paperwork and procuring dozens of signatures. Jim Irving and Ruth Irish spent countless hours providing treasurers' reports, charitable contribution documentation and much more. A mound of additional information was documented and compiled by others. The 501C3 status is retroactive to February 17, 1941. Another plus! All charitable contributions to HICC from individuals or estates are tax deductible.

Our beloved hall received a makeover this past year, beginning with repairs made in January to the roof and chimney caused by the December 2008 snow.

Thanks to HICC Women's Club's generous \$5,000 gift, a new dining room carpet and vacuum were purchased. It also covered the repainting of the kitchen, dining area, and a portion of the lighting upgrade. To help complete the face-lift additional grant funding came from PUD #3, which funded energy saving upgrades to the kitchen, dining room and restroom lighting.

This year the Ways and Means committee is recommending replacement of the outdated propane range and the addition of a range hood to meet current safety standards.

Over 1,000 copies have already found their way to island kitchens and beyond. The Women's Club and editors Della Rogers and Gerri Lewis are very pleased with the enthusiastic reception their latest contribution to Island culinary life has received. The

cover art is a 1992 seashell print by Pat Dunlap of the Harstine Island Gallery, and Cathy Prins created the pen-and-ink illustrations that dot the book. It's nine sections are introduced by glimpses of Harstine Island gastronomic history researched by Gerri Lewis. Specialized contributions were made by computer graphics whiz Sherry Ford, and

wordsmiths Donna Hamilton and Carleen Houghton. This all-volunteer effort features 375 taste-tested recipes collected from 110 islanders, and taste-tested by 30 members and their families and friends. The recipes include many original, never-before-published creations, adaptations, and even some "family secrets." ## Fire District 5

District 5 calls on the Island totaled 102 for 2009, compared with 100 in 2008, and 125 in 2007. Breakdown of last year's calls as follows: 64 EMS calls (illness or injury excluding motor vehicle accidents), 5 motor vehicle accidents ( 2 with injuries, 3 w/o ), 1 building fire, 4 motorhomes, camper, or RV fires, 1 cooking fire, a couple unauthorized burning and calls for smoke investigation, and the balance of the calls being for various assistance such as down power lines, citizen assists and service calls.

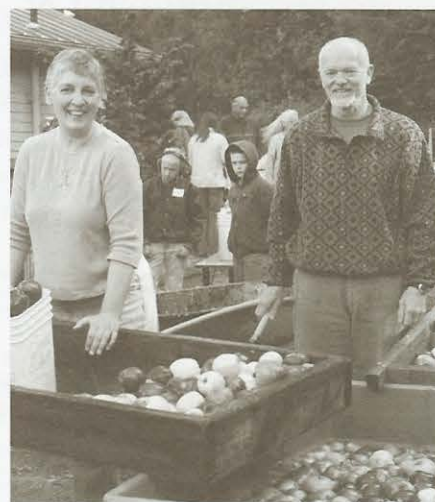
Current Island Volunteer roster is way down – currently only 4 volunteers and 1 career paid firefighter/paramedic and they are: Station 9 on North end: Lt. Nick Arthur, FF/EMT Colleen Arthur, FF/PM Travis Larrabee; Station 11 on South end: Lt. Nick Neuerburg, FF James Stevens. All calls are backed up by mainland staffed Paramedic/FF crews and Command Officer, with assistance from other nearby mainland stations when needed. With

additional grant funding this year, District has been able to add a additional Medic crew and have been responding out of Spencer Lake station, making for better response time for us on the Island. District 5 covers 150 sq. miles of Central Mason Co. and as 2008 the city of Shelton. With the addition of Shelton, Districts operates up to 4 manned stations ( 3 around the clock and Spencer Lake on shifts).

Along with medical and fire response, Mason 5 provides for CPR and First Aid training to the public, along with address markers, free home inspections, as well as education in fire prevention and emergency preparedness. The District continues to work with CERT – Community Emergency Response Teams – training members of the community in first aid, basic search and rescue, emergency preparedness as well as other aspects in coping with a disaster. Needing volunteers for both the Fire Dept. and for CERT and anyone interested can contact any Island Firefighter or call District 5 office.

The program continues and is called "Damon's Diner" in his memory. The lunch staff is headed by Barbara La June and many dedicated volunteers. Total meals served in 2009 = 1955 and \$956 was donated to the HICC to

defray utility costs. Additionally the staff donated their time and food to provide dinner to those attending the New Year's Dance. The number of people helping altered as the seasons changed, but there were always enough willing volunteers to cook, set-up, clean-up and plan meals. It is hard to imagine how they can provide the great meals at only \$3 per person!

## Grange #568

The Grange was founded over 80 years ago. It meets at the Hall the third Friday of each month; potluck dinner at 6:30 p.m. with the meeting at 7:30. Grange projects include the Annual Ham & Oyster dinner as the major fundraiser. Proceeds fund the Dictionary Program. Stuffed toys are made by Grangers and donated to local hospitals. Hearing aid batteries are collected and recycled to assist the less fortunate. Annual

donations to Saint's Pantry Food Bank in Shelton are made. The triangle on the island side of the bridge was planted and is maintained by the Grange. The large map of Harstine Island on the island side of the bridge was created and furnished by the Grange. The Grange works in conjunction with other island organizations to maintain cemeteries, assist with meals for memorials and earn funds to maintain the Community Hall.

## Harstine Island Women's Club

Women's Club provides a format to meet neighbors and become involved in the community.

**Social activities** include the monthly meeting (except July) where members gather for camaraderie and programs.

Lunch is either a brown-bag along with a provided dessert or one of our theme lunches.

**Holiday House** is a popular venue which showcases hand-crafted items, a perfect way to start your holiday shopping. It is held the Saturday after Thanksgiving at the Community Hall and Fire Station.

**Children's Carnival** is held the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday in August. Young people and adults work together to provide a fun-filled day for the children. There are games, clowns, and prizes. A great activity for children and grandchildren!

When someone from the island dies the women provide a **memorial lunch** at the

Community Hall. It is a service that allows the family to grieve as well as feel the sense of community the island provides. Generations mingle and the island history lives on.

If you want to show off your association with Harstine Island, there are logos galore at the **Women's Club booth** at the Saturday Market. Sweatshirts, fleece vests, denim shirts, visors, and of course T-shirts are some of the clothing items available. License plate holders and mugs are part of the various choices.

The book **The Island Remembers**, which gives a historical view of the island is available as well as our new cookbook, **Harstine Island Cooks!**

Many of these activities raise funds and the **use of those funds** is another important part of Women's Club. We provide **scholarships** for local students, contribute to Pioneer School and local food banks, and help with the expenses of keeping the Community Hall insured and in shape.

People who enjoy sewing meet monthly in each others homes on the third Tuesday from 10:00 to 2:00 to share handiwork, relaxation, and lunch.



## Garden Club

The Harstine Island Garden Club is one the most informally organized "clubs" in the HICC family of organizations, with a core membership who meet 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of the month, 7:00p.m. at the hall unless otherwise noted. Membership is open to all who are interested in gardening and gardens. Meetings often focus on garden issues, speakers, and destination garden visits. The main mission is to maintain the grounds of the community hall and other public island spaces, to contribute to the maintenance of the community hall and to be an environmental resource for all. This friendly and hard working group manages to produce a Plant Sale each spring which often

includes garden seminars and demonstrations, sponsors and manages the Saturday Market from early May to the first of
