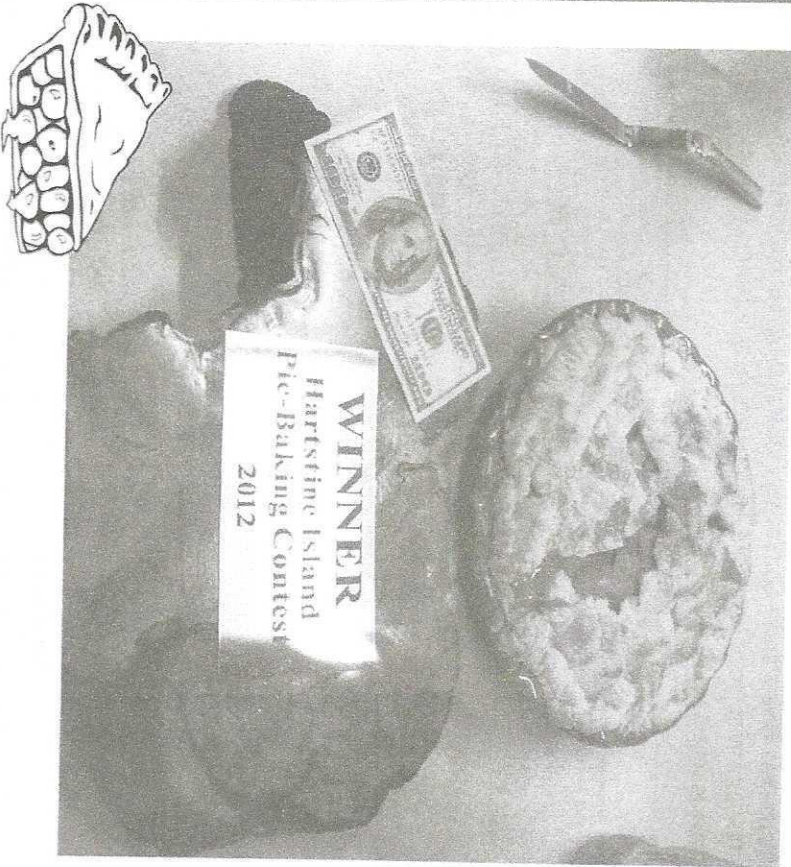

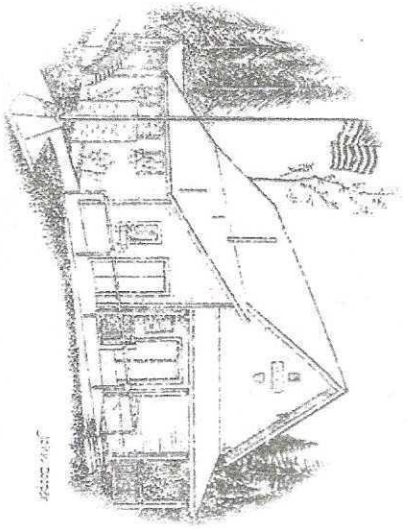

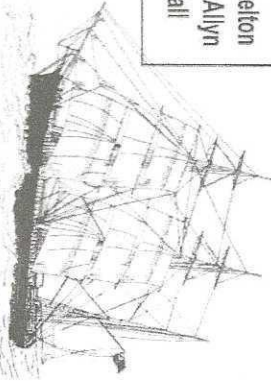
# Harstine Island Community Choir

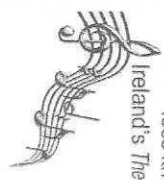

## 2012 Harstine Pie Contest

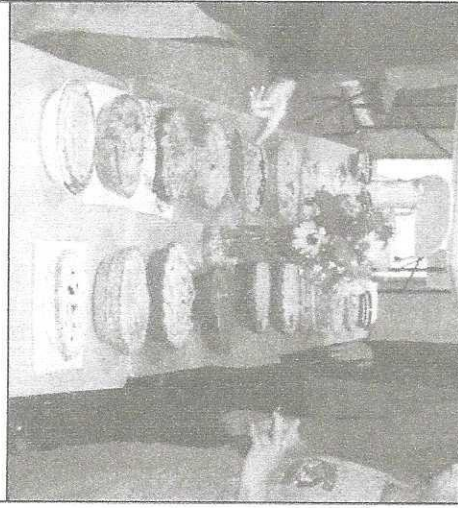

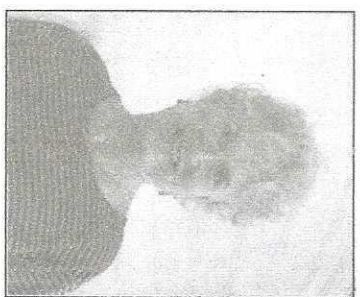

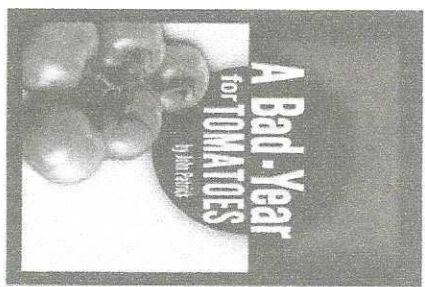

## Pinochle

Pinochle is a trick-taking card game typically for two to four players and played with a 48 card deck.

Derived from the card game bezique, players score points by trick-taking and also by forming combinations of cards into melds. It is thus considered part of a "trick-and-meld" category, which also includes a cousin, below. The standard game today is called "partnership auction pinochle." Skills required include strategy, social skills, teamwork and card counting.


**Pioneer Community Kiwanis Club**

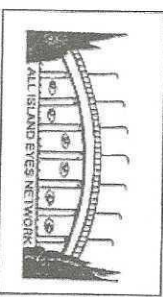

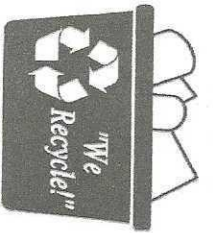

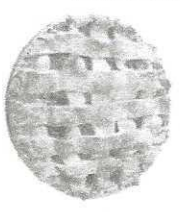
