





## HICC Citizen of the Year 2019

Larry came to Harstine Island in 2001, building a beautiful home on Case Inlet. He has quietly lent his hand to support the hall and community without fanfare over the years. During the 2014 Centennial Celebration at the Art & Much More Auction he purchased a keg of hand-crafted beer made by another islander, which he then generously donated to the Outdoor Picnic. He put in the parking bricks and bollards to designate parking spots between the flag pavilion and garden area. These are just a couple of the many things he has done throughout the years to benefit the community club and the hall. This year he was a major help to the bridge committee with the "Crossing of the Bridge Parade and the 50th Anniversary of the Bridge Celebration". Larry creatively put together the booklet "Connection to the Mainland A Brief History of the Island, it's ferries and the Harstine Island Bridge". The booklets were printed by him, which saved the community club over \$500 in printing.

Larry created the *Thumb-Drives of the 2019*Bridge Parade compiling photos by drone and several individuals at the event. He created a video presentation of the historical newspaper articles leading up to the funding and construction of the bridge, the 1969 dedication and parade and the 2009 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary parade. This took hours of time and dedication for a fundraiser for community club raising over \$750.

Following the potluck, he was the master of ceremony for the celebration. He used his artistic talents to build a replica of the bridge, which spanned the two cakes for the celebration. It is now in the display cabinet at the hall.

Larry helped with putting up the signage for the parade and parking before the event.




The Garden Club meets at noon on the second Tuesday of each month. Each meeting features a program, speaker, or a visit to a place of interest to gardeners. Meetings are often off site. Contact Lee Strohm to find out where the meetings are. Meetings are informal and open to anyone interested. The club sponsors the Farmers Market every Saturday from Memorial Day through September. The indoor market runs from October through May, except January. Market hours are 10 to noon. About 30 vendors sell art, crafts, baked goods, honey, and farm products. The first Saturday in May the club holds a plant sale.

We work during the year to start plants and make hyper-tufa pots, which are planted with sedums. In 2019, the club took on the resto-

ration of the Pioneer School green house and garden. We plan to have it functional by mid-February, 2020. Membership is open to anyone living on or off the island. Dues are \$15 a year.

The club is involved in social and charitable activities and all island women are welcome to participate. The Women's Club provides a feeling of belonging that only a small community can offer.

At most meetings, members bring a brown-bag lunch while a delicious dessert is provided by the club hostesses. Social time begins at 11:30 with lunch at noon. After lunch there is a program of interest to the group and a business meeting. The Women's Club is a great opportunity to meet neighbors and engage with the Harstine Island community.

When someone from the island passes on, the Women's Club provides a memorial lunch at the community hall. Club members bring home cooked dishes in addition to a main course purchased by the

club. The memorial lunch allows the family to grieve while feeling a sense of community.

The Women's Club has a booth at the Harstine Island Farmers Market. The Women's Club booth sells various items with the Harstine Island logo. Clothing items include sweatshirts, fleece vests, denim shirts, visors, and of course, T-shirts.

Every year there is a Holiday House on the Saturday after Thanksgiving at the community hall and fire hall. This is a popular venue for showcasing hand-crafted items and the perfect way to start your holiday shopping while enjoying a delicious lunch.

The Women's Club uses funds raised from the above activities to provide scholarships for Harstine Island residents. The club gave out several \$1500.00 scholarships to island residents as well as supporting the

Pioneer Middle School marching band. In addition, it contributes to the Pioneer Food Bank and provides funds to help with the expenses of keeping the community hall insured and maintained.

Jennifer, certified by Yoga Alliance, teaches a class on Tuesday and Thursday mornings at 8:30. Bring a mat, a blanket and prepare for an hour of stretching and relaxation.



# **Historian Report**

On June 14, 2019 we enjoyed the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Harstine Island Bridge with the Crossing of the Bridge Parade and Celebration.

# **Bridge Event Facts:**

There were 53+ vehicles, participating in the parade including decorated tractors, trucks, boats, lawn mowers and classic cars. Flag bearers, a marching band, walkers, people lining the bridge sidewalk, road, boat launch and looking up from boats were enthusiastic participants. A drone took photos from above. Spectators showed their spirit by waving flags and cheering.

## It was a BIG success!

Weather: overcast until 4:30 pm; the sun came out just in time for the parade.

The old ferry bell was rung from the island to start the parade as a nod to our history prior to the bridge.

Traffic control was great from the ferry line staging area, parking at Pickering Marine and the boat launch and thee islander's fields. We had three sheriff's deputies, three island corner guards and people pitching in wherever needed.

On the island side we had three new signs: a double-sided sign advertising the parade by Whickey Conway Larson; a hand painted island map by Cathy Prins; and a new reader board supplied by the community club. All are excellent additions to our community!

There were 20 tables set for people and food, with all the theater seats taken and people milling around. The Bridge Committee and HICC Board and families were seated on the stage.

From the video, potluck, guest speaker, program, sharing of bridge stories, Bridge Trivial Pursuit game and raffles to the clean-up it was a fun and rewarding event!

"It Takes an Island" thank you flyers were placed on each table along with the HICC regular business reports.

The hall was bursting at the seams, as noted by the 2nd Century Building Committee spokesperson. The  $2^{nd}$  Century Committee sold Bridge T-Shirts as a fundraiser.

"Connections to the Mainland: A Brief History of the Island, it's ferries, and Harstine Island Bridge" booklets were made available and thumb drives of the parade were ordered for delivery in three weeks.

The HICC paid all of the event expenses and came out with a profit of \$790.00.

Friday, June 14<sup>th</sup> was not only the Bridge Parade & Celebration, it was also Flag Day and the Army's 244th birthday (1775). The actual date of the bridge dedication was on Sunday, June 22, 1969.

Thank you to the Harstine Isand Community Club, the Bridge Committee, and to our community for participating in the *Bridge Experience* making it a day to remember!

# Jarrell's Cove Cemetery

Last year's regrouping of the Cemetery Committee has resulted in a significant boost in the attention given to the cemetery during this last year. The committee and volunteers have increased the maintenance of the shrubbery in the park. Much of the maintenance was due to the snow damage last winter. Fresh gravel was brought in for the driveway.

The Grace Spice family donated a lovely angel statuary last summer for the benefit of the entire park. 
