Second Century Building Fund

In 2023 the Second Century Building Fund Advisory Committee focused on the building infrastructure needed for an auxiliary building and a possible partnership with another non-profit organization (library, fire department, etc.) One of the things we've worked on is the well requirements if we were to use our existing well to add an auxiliary building. We also met with the Mason County Fire Marshal to understand building size requirements which require a fire alarm system and may require a sprinkler system.

The 2023 Second Century Building Fund Advisory Committee includes the following members: Benjamin Brodfuehrer, Jo Ewart, Cal Ison, and Dale McDaniel. We all aspire to create a place of community for current and future island generations.

Inquiring Minds

Inquiring Minds is a popular community service project proudly sponsored by Harstine Island Community Club in partnership with the Humanities Washington Speakers Bureau. Humanities Washington is a long-standing, statewide organization funded by the National Endowment for the Humanities, Washington State Legislature, and private donations.

The Speakers Bureau roster (humanities.org/speakers) includes many diverse and engaging speakers from which non-profit organizations may choose scholars, authors, teachers, musicians, historians, or experts in a given field. The goal is to spark conversation and critical thinking. The upcoming winter series is scheduled for the last Sunday in January, February, and March, and on an adjusted date in April, the newest addition to this long-running project.

Speakers are chosen in November by a vote of the HICC membership on a ballot drawn from nominations from the Bureau roster. The 2024 panel of speakers will be announced in December. Presentations are free (donations are accepted) and open to the public. Initiated in 2009 originally in a partnership with Grant School, this 2024 series will be the 16th year HICC has hosted this popular event which draws attendees from throughout Mason County and beyond, our historic hall being a wonderful Sunday afternoon winter destination. Adopt-a-Road

HICC adopted the six miles of road not covered by Kiwanis on E North Island Drive and E South Island Drive. Under the adopt-a-road agreement HICC has with Mason County, HICC performs four cleanups each year. In 2023, we removed approximately 52 bags of trash, along with five tires and various pieces of scrap lumber.

2024 cleanups have been tentatively scheduled for January 17–19, May 14–16, July 23–25, and October 22–24.
